

EASO then & now: evolution of EASO's activities over the last ten years & future perspectives

10th Consultative Forum virtual Plenary Meeting, 13 & 14 October 2020

Background Note & Draft Agenda

1. Background

EASO is organising the Consultative Forum Plenary as a virtual meeting in the mornings of 13 and 14 October. This year's Plenary marks the 10th edition of the Consultative Forum and the overall theme will focus on the evolution of EASO over the last ten years and perspectives for the future.

The very first edition of the Consultative Forum was organised in 2011 - the year that EASO became fully operational. Although expectations for the Agency were high, its resources were few, reflecting its stage of development as start-up agency. Now ten years on, EASO has developed into a full grown Agency and its role has adapted to the changing EU asylum and migration context and the growing needs of Member States. Over the years, the Agency has grown incrementally in some areas and exponentially in others, and its activities have expanded both in number as well as in scope.

EASO's operational activities have, in particular, evolved progressively and exponentially following the 2015 migration crisis in response to the growing need of Member States for operational support. The Agency has developed real operational capacities on the ground and is supporting frontline Member States with a variety of hands-on activities including, amongst others, assistance with information provision, registration, reception, assistance with backlog reduction and processing (both at first and second instance), as well as support provided to the Dublin Unit and on country of origin information, etc.

The expansion of activities has, however, not been limited exclusively to operations, as also in other areas the Agency has undergone a significant transformation fulfilling its role as main contributor to support the implementation of the CEAS. This includes for example, the development of common tools and guidance including operational standards and indicators, a common extensive Training Curriculum for national asylum and reception officials including the establishment of educational standards, common Country of Origin Information (COI), country guidance, information gathering, research and analytical work, as well as a wide range of asylum support activities through more than 13 networks on a variety of asylum topics.



EASO's activities may, in the near future, experience another transformation as the Commission proposal on a European Union Agency for Asylum remains on the table and as negotiations for the reform of the CEAS are expected to be relaunched with the new Pact on Asylum and Migration scheduled to be presented by the European Commission on 23 September. The finalisation and adoption of this Proposal would further reinforce the Agency's mandate.

On the occasion of its 10th edition, and with discussions on the future of the Agency expected to be resumed soon, it is therefore timely to look back on the development of EASO's activities over the last ten years, as well as to look at what is next, for the CEAS and the Agency's role therein.

2. Main aim of the meeting and focus areas for discussion

The main aim of the 10th Consultative Forum Plenary is to take stock of the evolution in EASO's activities over the last ten years as well as to look into future perspectives for the Agency as part of the evolving CEAS. More specifically, the following thematic EASO activity areas will be focused on in more detail:

- EASO's operational support in Member States
- Training and Professional Development
- Resettlement & complementary pathways
- Vulnerable groups
